of the Peoples of the North of the Sakha Republic (Yakutia), Ministry of Ecology of the Sakha Republic (Yakutia), regions of the Northern Forum.

Arctic in Brief:

The Arctic accounts for a tremendous amount of territory: 27 million km². It includes the North Pole, part of Eurasia and North America. Almost all of the Arctic countries – eight in total – have similar interests towards the Arctic. First of all, these are economic development, resource extraction, and logistics. Then, countries are concerned about the state of ecosystems and environmental pollution.

Yakutia in Brief:

Yakutia is at the same time #Siberia, the #North and the #Arctic. Yakutia is the largest administrative-territorial unit in the world, equal in its area to five Frances, with three time zones. Its size is 3 083 523 km². Lena is the largest river in Eastern Siberia, the 11th longest river in the world and has the 9th largest watershed. It is also the 3rd largest river in Asia, the Yakutians call her a “foster– grandmother”. Yakutian village Oymyakon is the coldest locality in the world. Yakutsk is the biggest city built on continuous permafrost and the majority of buildings are constructed on concrete piles. The unique Lena Pillars National Nature Park is in the UNESCO World Heritage List.
